

# **STUDENTS AS CHANGE AGENTS**

Students as Change Agents (SACHA) is an experiential learning programme that brings together students from different academic disciplines and levels to tackle real-world complex challenges with a social, environmental, or economic impact. The programme provides students with the opportunity for fast-track personal and professional development outside the classroom.

Due to COVID-19, SACHA transitioned online and organised four programmes throughout 2020-2021. Using different online discussion tools (Collaborate, Microsoft Teams, Mural), the programme has created an engaging virtual community that enhances the communication and collaboration between students, staff, and external partners – even when not in the same country!

## TRAINING

The first part of the programme consists of training in *Team Dynamics, Challenge Mindset*, and *Design and Data Tools*. The students learn how to communicate as a team online – skills that will be essential in the digital workplace.

### **LESSONS LEARNED**

Allocate extra time for the students to get comfortable with the digital platforms and tools.



### PRESENTATIONS

The third part of the programme includes the final presentations. The students present their report and video to the external partner and special guests. Afterwards, the students engage in a Q&A session to summarise the main points and share their thoughts.

# **LESSONS LEARNED**

Schedule a dress rehearsal to double check timing and reduce the odds for technical issues.

Doing this challenge, going through all the modules, and talking to everyone, you really realize there are things you can do. And I realized we already have the resources, it is just putting them together and contributing and working with others, and by taking these small steps it is possible to change people's lives. I think that is a very powerful message and one that I will be applying in the future. – Change Agent

#### MURAL

The second part of the programme utilises the project collaboration tool: Mural. The students navigate through board activities, such as *Research & Insights Using Data Tools* and *Empathy Mapping*, to explore the datasets, draw insights, and use data to create conversations. The tool enables innovative teams to brainstorm solutions to the challenge question and ensures that everyone's voice

is heard!

### **LESSONS LEARNED**

Give the students a brief break in between activities and keep the activities under 45 minutes to reduce the
