October 2019 goes down in history with the lowest monthly sea-ice extent on record




2. Would you eat local organic food at Xmas to save the planet from global warming?

As you move toward the right in the graph climate impacts decrease and food miles represent a more significant portion of the food's climate impact.



- 'Adapt' where we accept that climate change is coming and take measures to reduce its impacts.




Impacts of climate change in Europe



Temperature-related mortality impacts

It is virtually certain that the frequency and intensity of heat waves will increase in the future. This will lead to a substantial increase in mortality, especially in vulnerable population groups, unless adaptation measures are taken.






7. Do you contribute to Edinburgh being named as the 'worst city in Britain' for traffic congestion?

Edinburgh ranked 27th.






What does 1 tonne of CO₂ look like?







Allt Coire Ghaidheil

Illustrates how nature responds when the pressure of overgrazing is removed.

A 23.5 acre exclosure erected in 1994 for natural regeneration. In the last 25 years a profusion of blaeberry and other shrubs have sprung up. Scots pine, downy birch, rowan and willows are flourishing once again, providing a greatly-enhanced habitat for wildlife. [Costs £5 per tonne CO₂]



Natural regeneration at Coille Ruigh na Cuileige




A Scots pine showing growth from 1992 to 2015



Direct air capture


Climeworks'
