
South Edinburgh COVID-19 bubble: a sweep past 16 curling ponds - 6 mile walk visiting sixteen old curling localities

Start: Blackford Pond Gazebo, Cluny Dr., Braid Av., Cluny Av., Morningside Rd., Millar Cres., Royal Ed., Community Garden, Myreside railway path, Craiglockhart Ter., Craiglockhart Pond, Leisure Cente, Craiglockhart Wood, Grounds of Craig House, East Craiglockhart Hill (250ft ascent, mainly on steps), Comiston Dr., Greenbank Cres., Braid Rd., Hermitage, Blackford Pond, End.

2094 Royal Edinburgh Hospital, oval curling pond 250 ft long; maps of 1898 & 1909.


0668 Myreside, Edinburgh. Curling ponds marked on OS 25inch map of 1908.


2016 Union Canal, Edinburgh. Location near here identified in the Caledonian Mercury in February 1855.


1879 Waverley artificial pond on concrete base. Waverley Curling Club formed 1901.


0632 Craiglockhart. Curling ponds in deep glacial valley of Megget Burn. Curling Club formed 1887.



















Edinburgh's old curling ponds. (Full list see www.historicalcurlingplaces.org) In the late 19th and early 20th century there were more than 50 locations within the city, on natural ponds (e.g. Duddingston Loch), artificial ponds (e.g. now engulfed Cameron Toll Shopping Centre) and cement (Waverley) or tarmac rinks (Myreside).

Scope and Content The Greenbank Curling Pond, Braid Road, Morningside, Edinburgh The Braid estate, one of the large estates that surrounded the old village of Morningside, was a rural area of open fields and countryside that stretched south from the Jordan Burn, the southern boundary of the city of Edinburgh. The curling pond, now the site of the Mortonhall Tennis Club, stood behind a low wall close to the bridge over the Braid Burn, and opposite the entrance to the Hermitage of Braid, the old mansion house of the Braid estate, in Braid Road. In the 19th century curling was a popular winter activity on local ponds, and had an enthusiastic following. Curling matches were held regularly at Greenbank, and Blackford Pond was the home of the thriving Waverley Curling Club, established in 1848. Source: RCAHMS contribution to SCRAN.

Description In January 1900, Edinburgh experienced snow storms and a hard frost. The sport of curling became possible in several places including Blackford Pond shown in this photograph. The houses lie along the Mortonhall Road / Blackford Gate ridge. Arthur's Seat can be glimpsed in the background.
