Its phonetic resemblance to the sound of falling dominoes further resonates with our annual programme, the Domino Project. This linguistic coincidence represents a marvellous fusion of cultures and the art of nature, highlighting our commitment to interculturalism, diversity, and ingenuity.

As a collective specialising in contemporary art curating, we are devoted to guiding our audience around diverse contemporary themes and rich connotations encapsulated within the notion of Pili Pala. 



Integrity and Responsibility: We authentically present artworks and artists' backgrounds, convey their voices with respect and accuracy, and unswervingly practice our social responsibilities.


About The Domino Project

The Domino Project interconnects and interlocks our curators' individual practices, weaving them into a cohesive and captivating narrative. By orchestrating a series of exhibitions and events, it provides a multifaceted lens through which to contemplate the contemporary art world synchronically and diachronically.

In the Domino Project, a diversity of exhibitions is activated and unfolded in succession at various times of the year to create a temporal sequence, while the venues and spaces where they occur are connected in a coherent pattern from a synchronic viewpoint. In this way, exhibitions are no longer isolated, transient events as they never should have been. Instead, they have evolved into more extended and continuous forms with a greater impact through an invisible dominoes-like chain.

The Domino Project breaks through the conventional paradigm of curating and viewing as it liberates them from the constraints of physical location and space. We leverage the natural magnetic attraction between exhibitions and cultivate intentional connections, to empower curators and artists to engage with one another while retaining their independence and freedom.

As Pili Pala aims to ignite new sparks of creativity and vitality, the Domino Project provides an inspiring platform for curators and artists to communicate, a fresh approach for audiences to access art spaces, as well as a synchronic snapshot and chronological view for researchers to observe the contemporary art world.

The visual landscape is dominated by the saturation of HD images. To capture a satisfying image requires meticulous orchestration of camera modes. Conversely, an image is foreseeable to produce noises, fractures, dissonance and a nauseous aesthetic under the setting of a fault mode. The exhibition showcases thousands of poor images produced by Chinese artist Huangyu, portraying the artist's roaming state, through which he crosses over the line between the real world and the dreamy landscape. His gaze penetrates the pandemonium of the urban district, condensing everything in extreme abstraction in the monochromatic landscape. Behind the blown-up pixels, the true living status of life is slowly being revealed.



The frequency of a sound determines whether that sound can be heard. In Scotland minority voices seem to be heard and responded to in most cases only by people of the same ethnicity, for others the voices are out of their hearing range.

The program Hertz is led by Scottish artists and activists focusing on racial injustice, race discrimination, minority interests, and social dissonance. There will be 4 episodes of events taking forms of round-table conference and work shop held over four weekends in July and August. The events will be hosted by contemporary art practitioners, bringing together the audiences to make artworks collectively, sharing stories, dance and relax. The events aim to explore how art practices can become part of systemic transformation, giving voice to minorities, dealing with misrepresentation and underrepresentation of ethnical minority people, and provide care and affective support to minorities in community. In addition the program will develop long-term collaboration with other organisations to provide employment assistance, housing grants, and legal assistance.

In an era dominated by the expansion of image power and AI algorithmic production, the term *grey zone* has been used to describe our media environment. The *greyness* has been blurring everything through mediatization, giving complex effects to the image and the viewer, and thus suspending the debate on the meaning of various contradictory terms in a field full of possibilities.

This screening programme seeks to guide the audience through an exploration of moving images as a medium in the *grey zone*. We invite viewers to contemplate the authenticity and ambiguity of what they see and to reflect on the inherent subjectivity of human beings as both creators and viewers.



EPILOGUE

When curating a single exhibition, the Domino Project, featuring a concept-driven curatorial style, "consciously lengthens the usual conduct of curating into a continuous process, with the forms of artworks and information changing at any time" (Feng, 2009).

When we introduce the notion of domino into our organisation's way of programming our curatorial projects, it intentionally strings together, continuously piles and extends each of them. In this way, the Domino Project constructs a new pattern of exhibitions, which could be a thread that has been guiding us to explore the infinite space of contemporary art.
