

Filmhouse event



The Everyday Cyborgs and Humanimals event on April 14th at the Filmhouse was the first public screening of four short films exploring fears, hopes and anxieties, as well as the everyday reality, of being not-fully-human. The films were made by local artists, creatives, and a group of young people, as part of the Animal, Mechanical and Me: The Search for Replaceable Hearts project led by Dr Gill Haddow in Science Technology and Innovation Studies at the University of Edinburgh and funded by the Wellcome Trust.

The project explores patient experiences and public reactions to using material from non-human animals or from implantable cybernetic systems to repair, replace or regenerate the human body. It seeks to bring patients' experiences, anxieties, and wider questions around human identity and selfhood, to bear on conversations about recent developments in medical technology. The film screening was part of a more general attempt to showcase social science research at Edinburgh University to wider audiences, and to generate public awareness and debate about these issues.

We decided to wear rainbow lanyards in addition to the classic dark-blue one to promote a more inclusive public image of the University, but also to pay tribute to the LGBT+ contributions to academic thought around identity, selfhood, and embodiment, and around the figure of the cyborg in the Western cultural

imaginary.

Rainbow Lanyards



We have been overwhelmed by the enthusiasm for our Rainbow Lanyards and are delighted that the latest batch of 4000 Rainbow Lanyards has been delivered. Our RL Distribution Team of 6 has a small backlog at the moment, and will send out your order as quickly as they can. Any help with this would be appreciated. If you'd like to help, let us know!

Of the 4000 lanyards already delivered, Card Services have funded 1400 for new staff who will be able to choose between a blue and rainbow lanyard; Finance, Student Wellbeing, ISG Library Services and Informatics have paid for 700 lanyards for their own staff; Finance, Card Services and Social Responsibility & Sustainability have donated 1400 to the Staff Pride Network for us to supply others throughout the University; and the shop ordered 500 to sell at a reasonable £2 to students, alumni and members of the public.

We were even contacted by an Edinburgh Business School PhD student who wanted to wear one of our rainbow lanyards to her viva!

Happy LGBT+ History Month! As part of a diverse calendar of events (see the events section below for details), on Thursday 8 February we will launch our new official University of Edinburgh Rainbow Lanyards. This is a big step for the University – with funding from Communications & Marketing, we've decided on two designs for LGBT+ and Ally staff members. With such an obvious symbol, we can show to new staff, students, alumni and visitors that our workplace is inclusive, and our campuses can become walking rainbows! You can choose between the "University of Edinburgh" or "University of Edinburgh LGBT+ Ally" designs. Pick yours up at an event, or email us and we will send it to you in internal mail. To reach out to the 13,000 staff across the University, we have ambitions to achieve SPN reps in every School or building, and Peter Tennant is leading this Site Rep project. Please read his introduction in this newsletter and email him if interested. On a corporate level, we worked with Procurement to improve policy wording and they have now included a new "LGBT+ community benefit" in their supplier contracts.

As well as the regular Central & KB Lunchtime and evening socials and joint staff-student network monthly lunch, Gina organised a poignant event in November commemorating Transgender Day of Remembrance and in December Remus organised collection boxes in Uni buildings and a World AIDS Day discussion on HIV stigma. Finally I'd like to express my thanks to all the SPN volunteers for their time and dedication, resulting in the University rising 132 places in the Stonewall Workplace Equality Index in the last year. At their Workplace Conference in November we were delighted to feature as a best practice example of a network starting up. We are looking forward to continuing our efforts to make the University an even more inclusive place to work and study.

Transgender Day of Remembrance

In commemoration of Transgender Day of Remembrance 17 November, the Staff Pride Network is organising a special screening of the Chilean movie *A Fantastic Woman* (2017). Following the screening, a post-movie panel of members will hold an open discussion on the issues the film raises. Directed by Sebastián Lelio and starring trans actress Daniela Vega, *A Fantastic Woman* tells the story of trans character Marina, whose life is tragically cut short following the death of her lover. The film looks at the reaction of her family as well as the reactions of her employers, winning best screenplay at the 2017 Berlin Film Festival. The film is described by The Guardian's Rafe Kilbey as "a timely film, but it is its tenderness, as well as its depth of compassion, that qualify it as a great one."

Zoe Robinson – Dissertation: The Invisibility of 'B' in 'LGBT'

A Bc student from the Business School has been awarded 2B for her dissertation entitled 'The Invisibility of 'B' in 'LGBT': Organisations & Supportive Working Environments for Bisexual Employees'. She was happy to share it with SPN members and describes her dissertation thus: "Bisexuality is a complex topic, together with binary attitudes toward sexual orientation however have left bisexuality largely acknowledged and overlooked both within the academic sphere and in an organisational context. My dissertation discusses the invisibility of bisexuality in the workplace by exploring discourses and perception of bisexuality, and organisational supportive practices. In turn, recommendations are made for how firms can best support and maximise the potential of their bisexual employees." It's easy to imagine the weariness of an asexual-identifying person confronted with the daily stream of images in pop culture, and seeing themselves as outsiders and wanting greater recognition, and accommodation.
