Institute for Academic Development

The IAD has supported the Technician Commitment at the University since inception. The IAD offers a wide range of courses to help with career development with most open to technicians. The most recent IAD Insights Magazine had a focus on the Technician Commitment.

Career Development Support for Technicians

In September 2017 the University of Edinburgh signed the Technicians Commitment in recognition of the role technicians' play in research, teaching and supporting students. Since then HR and the IAD have been working collaboratively to develop a career development framework and programme of support for Technicians. This includes:

Take Charge of Your Career:

A 2hr session providing an overview of the new technicians career development programme, including tools and opportunities available from within the University and beyond. (Running at different campus' between Oct 2019 - Feb 2020)

Career Insights:

1hr discussions with speakers and other technicians to allow you to explore the different career paths available. (Running from Jan - May 2020). *A one-off Career Insights will run on the 23rd October focussing on support for Professional Registration*.

Taking Steps to Plan Your Career:

A 1-day workshop to allow you to identify steps in planning your career. (Running at different campus' from Jan - April 2020)

Professional Registration Fund:

Funding has been secured for the Academic Year 19/20 to support technicians who would like to apply for Professional Registration. The scheme will cover the Science Council registration fees and membership of a professional body for one year. Professional registration is a great way of formalising your career path and supporting further career development. Technician Lens on the Vitae Researcher Development Framework (RDF):

RDF Lenses can be used to help you focus on a particular area of expertise and identify how this contributes towards your professional development. The technicians' lens will be developed in the next few months and available to all technicians to support their training and development.

Technician Awards

Congratulations to Morwenna Muir, IGMM, who won one of the University of Edinburgh 3Rs Awards 2019. The awards are designed for animal technicians and scientists to promote the 3Rs (reduction, refinement and replacement of animals in research). Morwenna's work focused on bioluminescent imaging to follow breast cancer tumour growth and metastasis, and established an intraductal implantation model (MIND) that has been shown to recapitulate human mammary tumour formation more closely than other commonly used animal models.
